Dizzy Gillespie's hometown of Cheraw ushers in its 13th year of the South Carolina Jazz Festival October 19-21 with three days of great jazz and exciting activities. The weekend, which coincides with the 101st anniversary of Gillespie's birth, will showcase the unique bond Gillespie shared with his South Carolina roots and jazz. A wide variety of both free and ticketed concerts and events are scheduled for Friday and Saturday, October 19-20. The festival culminates on Sunday, October 21, with a Jazz Mass at Cheraw First Baptist Church.

Over 25 Jazz performances are scheduled during the festival including in-school performances. These concerts will feature regional musicians from both North and South Carolina and beyond. There will be an exhibit of Jazz quilts by SC fiber artist Dr. Marlene Linton O'Bryant-Seabrook. 
Art abounds during the weekend with "Jazzy" trees and the festival's 10th Italian Madonnari Chalk Competition. Market on Market returns with produce, food and




