Domestic Violence Awareness Month Vigil is Oct. 26

This is a release from the Anson County Domestic Violence Coalition (ACDVC) October is Domestic Violence Awareness Month. According to the NCADV website, Domestic Violence Awareness month was first observed in 1987. Anson County Domestic Violence and Rape Crisis Center (ACDVC) participates in the Silent Witness program during the month of October to mourn those who have died because of domestic violence, celebrating those who have survived, and connecting those who work to end violence.

During October, life-sized wooden figures will be placed in the county, each one bearing the name of a person who once lived, worked, had friends, family - whose life ended violently at the hands of a partner, spouse, ex-spouse or acquaintance.

Domestic Violence often goes unreported. In Anson County, from July 2022 to June 2023, ACDVC assisted 246 victims of domestic violence. The age bracket with the highest incident is 26-40 years old. We had 429 calls to our crisis hotline. According to statistics, one in three women and one in four men have been victims of some form of physical violence by their intimate partner. According to the North Carolina Coalition Against Domestic Violence, every nine seconds a woman is assaulted. From January 1 to September 19, 2023, there were 75 domestic violence related deaths in North Carolina alone.

On Thursday, October 26, 2023, at 6:00 p.m. ACDVC invites anyone who has a friend or loved one represented here or if you have been or know someone that has been affected by domestic violence to come and join us during this special time of remembrance. This year, there is a new location for the vigil which will be held in front of Anson County Domestic Violence & Rape Crisis Center, located at 204 East Wade Street in uptown Wadesboro.
