## **Anson County Covid-19 Update**

Ansonians urged to get vaccinated.

Flu shots now available at the Health Department.

The latest information posted by the Anson County Health Department on Monday, October 18 showed 3,816 total Covid-19 cases, with 58 active. There were three additional deaths from Covid-19 in the last week, bringing the total deaths to 80.

Vaccines are available, including walk-in clinics. They are free, and all you have to do is call the Health Department at 704-694-5188 for more information.

Now free testing is available Monday through Friday,  $8\ \mathrm{a.m.}$ to 6 p.m. without an appointment. Testing takes place in the old hospital parking lot on Morven Road. They are testing Monday to Friday, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. No appointment is needed and there is no charge for the Covid test. Results will be called or emailed directly to the person tested or, in the case of children, to their parent or adult caregiver, in 2-3 days. They will test anyone over the age of 1. Flu Shots The Health Department is offering both the

regular flu shot and the high dose flu shot, for those 65 and over, on Monday and Wednesday afternoons, between 1:30 and 4 p.m. No appointment is needed. Just come on over to the Health Department with your ID and your insurance card and they will take care of you.

The Health Department is located at 110 West Ashe Street in Wadesboro. The telephone number is The NC Department of Health and Human Services

(NCDHHS) reported that statewide as of Monday, October 18 there were 1,599 new cases, with 17,536 deaths and 1,852 hospitalized. 70% of adults in NC had at least one dose of vaccine, 66% were fully vaccinated.
