### October 26 School Board Meeting Will be Live Streamed on YouTube

The Anson County Board of Education will hold their regular board meeting on Monday, October 26. The meeting will begin at 4:00 p.m. with Closed Session, and Open Session to the public will begin at 5:30 p.m. The meeting will be live streamed through YouTube. The public is invited to watch the meeting by following the Anson County Schools Youtube Channel beginning at 5:30 p.m. To find the

channel you can search YouTube for "Anson County Schools." Due to live streaming the meeting, if the public wishes to sign up for public comment they can go to the public comment link on the schools website at *www.ansonschools.org* to sign up. Public comment sign up will be from 4:45 p.m. to 5:15 p.m. on October 26. Open Session to the public begins at 5:30 p.m.

The Anson County Board of Education welcomes comments from parents, students, and the community. The public comment period is open for members of the public to voice compliments, concerns, or complaints about matters of public concern, the performance of school personnel, implementation of board policy, the quality of the education program or school facilities, or other matters. The Public Comment portion of the meeting is for the Board to hear matters of interest or concern from the public; however, obscene or vulgar statements, personal attacks and statements reasonably perceived to be disruptive or imminently threatening to the orderly operation of the meeting shall not be permitted. Comments are limited to three minutes per submission, and a maximum of 30 minutes will be devoted to the public comment portion of the agenda.

### **Roshunda Terry Recognized for Her Census Efforts**

Anson County Cooperative Extension Director Roshunda Terry was recognized by the Anson County Board of Commissioners at their October 6 meeting for her hard work and dedication in working on the 2020 Census in Anson County. She received a plaque signed by County Manager Barron Monroe that stated: Certificate of Appreciation "Above & Beyond" presented to Mrs. Roshunda Terry for Outstanding Performance and Productiveness in Anson County. Awarded October 6, 2020.

Monroe said, "This year has been a very difficult year to conduct the Census count with COVID-19. We assigned a Complete Count Committee at the beginning of this year, and Mrs Terry has led it remarkably. She has done a great job getting out to the community and finding ways to reach out to people who would normally not be counted."

Monroe continued, "Mrs. Terry stepped up a great deal. I asked her to do this and she took ownership of the entire project. Because of that I didn't have to worry about anything. Mrs. Terry has put forth more effort toward this than a normal volunteer would have, and I appreciate the efforts and the time that she put into it. So, I wanted to recognize her with our Above and Beyond Award."

Terry said, "I have never looked at this as a one person show. It took everyone who made up the Complete Count Committee to put forth efforts to help spread the word and educate citizens on the importance of the 2020 Census. Our committee was served by the following individuals: County Manager Barron Monroe; Christopher Harrington; Vanesa Tran; Caroline Goins; Shelby Emrich; Desiree Cox; Wanda Talbert; Sherika Staton; Dinikia Savage; Lisa Holt; Nelson Jackson and Carol Smith."

Terry continued, "We started work in September of last year and created subcommittees and a strategic plan as to how we would publicize Census. To every elected official, agency, business, organization and foundation that partnered with us on the Census, I thank them. As of today, October 15, our number of self responses (only those who completed the Census by mail, phone or internet) for the county is 52.6%. Ten years ago it was 55.2%. Considering what 2020 dealt us, I am very happy with the outcome of these numbers, despite not having face to face contact and outdoor events like we had planned. I am truly honored for the recognition. It was just a task that was assigned to me."

## 692 Reported Cases of COVID-19 in Anson County

### Health Department encourages mask use to protect yourself and others

As of Monday, October 19 the Anson County Health Department posted that Anson County had 692 reported cases of COVID-19. 34 of those cases were active. At that point they had discharged 658 cases, 650 to baseline health and eight deaths.

In a release on October 19 the Health Department stated, "With the number of cases rising in our state, we would like to encourage people to take a part in protecting themselves and others. Remember to wear a mask, keep distance from others, wash your hands often, and download the SLOWCOVID app. Learn more about the free SlowCOVIDNC Exposure Notification app at *covid19.ncdhhs.gov/SlowCOVIDNC*. #StayStrongNC. Let's all do our part!"

The NC Department of Health and Human Services (NCDHHS) reported statewide as of Monday, October 19 there were 247,172 total cases of COVID-19, with 3,939 deaths, 3,640,086 completed tests and 1,142 currently hospitalized.

As of October 13 there were 234,481 total cases of COVID-19, with 3,816 deaths, 3,437,598 completed tests and 1,103 currently hospitalized. On Monday, October 5 there were 219,754 total cases of COVID-19, with 3,637 deaths. 3,188,371 completed tests and 971 currently hospitalized.

### Free Remote Learning Virtual Conference Available for Teachers, Parents on October 28

All North Carolina teachers and parents are invited to attend a free virtual conference on Wednesday, October 28 to help them navigate technology and remote learning.

"Teachers, parents and students have adapted to new ways of learning throughout the pandemic, and I admire your resilience, creativity and dedication," Governor Roy Cooper said. "Even as we work to get children back into the classroom safely our schools and families need support for remote learning and this conference is one way we're providing that help."

The REAL 2.0 (Remote Education & Learning) Conference will include sessions by experts in fields including education, mental health and technology. The conference is hosted by the North Carolina Business Committee for Education (NCBCE), a education nonprofit housed in the Governor's Office. It will build upon the initial REAL Conference attended by more than 1,300 educators in August to learn about best practices for remote learning during the COVID-19 pandemic. Educators from across the state are serving as content advisers for REAL 2.0. Sessions for parents will be available in both English and Spanish, and all sessions will include closed captioning. For educators, topics covered will include: navigating asynchronous learning; how to teach students effective study habits, time management and daily routines for virtual learning; tips and timesavers in Canvas; ideas for getting students motivated during virtual learning; Google Classroom and Google Meets tips and tricks; resources for struggling students; addressing the needs of exceptional learners in the regular classroom; video creating and editing tips; and much more. Exceptional student needs will be addressed throughout the sessions. For parents, sessions will include: digital literacy; understanding Canvas and Google Classroom; how to support children with autism during remote learning; the college application and FAFSA process; fostering good mental health for parents and their children; and much more. Recordings of the REAL 2.0 Conference will be available at the same link following the conference and educators can also view the recordings from the first REAL Conference at the same link. REAL 2.0 is the second in a series of four virtual remote learning conferences that will be held through Governor Roy Cooper's NC Student Connect initiative. The STEM Connect Conference will be held on November 17, 2020 for STEM educators to learn best practices for incorporating STEM into the virtual classroom, and the Cultural Arts LIVE Conference will be held on December 15-16, 2020 for arts and humanities educators and their classes.
