Students Needed to be CBCC Holiday Heroes

Area high school and college students can earn a scholarship by hosting a blood drive

The Community Blood Center of the Carolinas (CBCC) has kicked off its annual "Holiday Heroes" program to give high school and college students a chance to win a 1,000 college scholarship by hosting a blood drive during the holiday season.

To qualify for a "Holiday Heroes Scholarship," students must host a blood drive in their community between Nov. 22-30 or between Dec. 20-Jan. 4; recruit friends, family and neighbors to donate blood; and collect a minimum of 25 units. CBCC will award a \$1,000 college scholarship to the student who collects the most units.

"Students make up about 25 percent of our donor base, and when they are out of school, donations drop significantly; paired with the busy holiday season and winter ill-nesses, collection levels often become seriously low this time of year," said Martin Grable, president and CEO of the Community Blood Center of the Carolinas. "We count on our students to host holiday blood drives. By hosting a blood drive during the 'giving' season, students can impact the lives of hundreds of local patients who are counting on our community to ensure they have the blood they need. The Community Blood Center of the Carolinas is committed to supporting students and has awarded over \$172,750 in scholarships and grants since 2009. Over the last 6 years, 23,301 lives have been saved as a result of student-hosted blood drives," Grable said. The Community Blood Center of the Carolinas (CBCC) is a non-profit communitybased blood center and the primary blood supplier to 27 regional hospitals, serving 19 North Carolina and three South Carolina counties. 

Residents living in and around the Wadesboro community can be screened to reduce their risk of having a stroke or bone fracture. First United Methodist Church will host Life Line Screening on October 28. The site is located at 118 East Morgan Street in Wadesboro. Servio Manderochio of Holly Springs, NC attended a Life Line Screening and said, "I can't begin to thank you enough. The screening you performed save my life."

Four key points every person needs to know:

- Stroke is the third leading cause of death and a leading cause of permanent disability
- 80% of stroke victims had no apparent warning signs prior to their stroke
- Preventive ultrasound screenings can help you avoid a stroke
- Screenings are fast, noninvasive, painless, affordable and convenient

Screenings identify potential cardiovascular conditions such as blocked arteries and irregular heart rhythm, abdominal aortic aneurysms, and hardening of the arteries in the legs, which is a strong predictor of heart disease. A bone density screening to assess osteoporosis risk is also offered and is appropriate for both men and women.


