You will find holiday and decorative items, ornaments, jewelry, pottery, stained glass, walking sticks, wreaths, wood crafts, quilts, birdhouses and feeders, pine needle baskets, painted boxes and furniture, fairy houses, bears, gourd art, totes, pillows and much more by talented vendors from Anson County, Monroe, Charlotte, Rockingham, Albemarle, Mt. Gilead, Oakboro, Greensboro and surrounding areas.

Christmas in November is a public service project of the Anson County Arts Council for area residents and the creative community. Admission is free, and there's plenty of free parking. Vendors keep 100% of their sales.

### **CoWorking Wednesdays to Begin November 7**

On Wednesday, November 7, and the first Wednesday of each subsequent month, the Burns Conference Room at the Anson County Chamber of Commerce will be transformed into a coworking space for the use of all Anson County-based businesses. CoWorking Wednesdays is a new initiative jointly sponsored by the Anson County Chamber of Commerce, Uptown Wadesboro and the Anson Economic Development Partnership (AnsonEDP).

Coworking is a concept that has gained a lot of momentum in urban and suburban areas over the past few years, but is just now being tried in more rural areas. Basically, the idea is to create a community of entrepreneurs and small business owners who share space and services in an open and collaborative way; think of it as a cross between a Starbucks, a pack and ship store and key man offices. It acts as an incubator of sorts for the information and gig economy.

As the economy has become more focused on knowledge, experience and information as commodities, there has been a proliferation of small businesses and individual contractors who provide a wide variety of services on a contract basis. This is sometimes referred to as the "gig" economy or "side hustle" economy. These enterprises, which range from freelance graphic designers to online security consultants to bloggers often operate from a spare bedroom or the kitchen table and meet with clients at a local hangout, like McDonalds or Starbucks. Coworking spaces provide a more structured and collaborative place for these businesses to set up shop. Participants benefit from working in close proximity to other similarly focused people in a business-oriented setting. There is typically a programmatic side, as well, with speakers discussing topics relevant to these individuals.

Eventually, the three organizations hope to partner with the private-sector to create a permanent coworking space in Uptown Wadesboro that would feature a coffee bar, mail service, pack and ship and conference room. As a first step and proof of concept, CoWorking Wednesdays will be held at the Chamber on the first Wednesday of each month. On those days, the Burns Conference Room will be open from 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. for any Anson County business that wants to spend some or all of their day working from that space. Businesses do not have to be members of the Chamber to participate. Coffee and donuts will be provided in the morning and sandwiches and sodas will be brought in for lunch. Each CoWorking Wednesday will also feature a guest speaker from 12 noon until 12:30 p.m. The speaker for November 7 will be AnsonEDP executive director John Marek, who will be discussing grant funding for startups and small businesses.

# Memoir Workshop with Joseph Bathanti November 17

If you have been thinking of writing a memoir but don't know how to get started, an upcoming workshop will provide the answer. Joseph Bathanti, Writer-in-Residence at Appalachian State University's Watauga Residential College in Boone, will lead a Memoir Workshop in Wadesboro on Saturday, November 17. The workshop will be held in the First Presbyterian Church fellowship hall, from 10 a.m. until 5 p.m. The cost is \$25 and participation is limited to 15. Bathanti said, "The workshop is designed to get participants thinking about specific episodes that in some way exemplify their identities as citizens of a place (however one uses to identify/characterize place) and how that very decided identity has influenced them, especially as it pertains to living in the South (as a native or transplant), but especially in Anson County, though other locales might be involved as well." "A manageable way to tackle writing a memoir is to zero in on something specific," Bathanti continued. "Participants will be encouraged to bring old photographs and other artifacts that prove invaluable in jumpstarting memory and the writing impulse. Whether you consider yourself a practiced writer, a beginner – or even someone who has never attempted to write before – this workshop welcomes you. Bathanti is the author of 10 books of poetry as well as novels, short story collections, and a book of personal essays. He has won numerous awards, including the 2006 Novello Literary Award, the 2006 Spokane Prize, and the Will D. Campbell Award for Creative Nonfiction. Ansonians remember Bathanti as a Visiting Artist in the mid-1980s with what was then Anson Community College. His experiences culminated in a book of poetry, aptly titled "Anson County."
