Flu Shots are Available Now at the **Anson County Health Department**

The 2017-2018 flu season is rapidly approaching, and you may be undecided about whether to get the flu shot. The New England Journal of Medicine reports that receiving your yearly flu shot is a heart smart move. The Journal reports that the odds of having a heart attack are increased five fold in the first three days of diagnosis of influenza. Infection triggers an inflammatory response throughout the body that causes a narrowing of arteries and stresses the heart.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends vaccination before December to ensure that protective antibodies are in your system before flu activity is typically at its highest. The CDC continues to encourage vaccination throughout the flu season, which may begin as early as October and last through May.

While the CDC's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) recommends everyone over the age of 6 months should get the flu vaccine each season, it is especially important for the following high risk groups: Pregnant women

- Children younger than 5, but especially children younger than 2 years old
- People 50 years of age and older
- People of any age with certain chronic medical conditions

• People who live in nursing homes and other long-term care facilities

 People who live with or care for those at high risk for complications from flu, including:

Health care workers

 Household contacts of persons at high risk for complications from the flu

 Household contacts and out of home caregivers of children less than 6 months of age

The Anson County Health Department has Flu shots (influenza vaccine) for the 2017-2018 season available now. Flu shots will be available by appointment only Monday through Friday. Flu shots are free for uninsured children 18 years old and younger, or uninsured pregnant women. Most major insurances are accepted. On Wednesday, October 18 at about 1 p.m. deputies from the Anson County Sheriff's Office were dispatched to Deep Creek Road in the Southern part of Anson County in reference to suspicious persons in the area. He is currently in custody of the Anson County Jail under a \$35,000 secure bond, with a court date set for October 31, 2017 in Anson County District Court.

The second individual was identified as Carnelle Alexander Hall, 31, of Polkton. Hall was charged with Felony Breaking and Entering and Felony Larceny. He is currently in the Anson County Jail under a \$2,500 secure bond, with a court date set for October

Medicare Open Enrollment is Underway, Runs Until Dec. 7

The Medicare enrollment period is now open and runs for the next seven weeks. Each year during the Open Enrollment Period, Medicare beneficiaries have the opportunity to compare and evaluate their current plan and make changes as necessary. By comparing plans during the Open Enrollment Period, Medicare beneficiaries can save money and ensure their 2018 plan is best suited to meet their needs.

The Open Enrollment Period began October 15 and all changes must be made by December 7 to ensure coverage begins without interruption January 1.

"Comparing Part D plans annually is imperative to ensure the Medicare beneficiary has the best coverage for their prescription needs," said North Carolina Insurance Commissioner Mike Causey. "The staff from SHIIP, the Seniors' Health Insurance Information Program are available to help over the phone or in-person in all 100 counties in North Carolina."

SHIIP is a division of the North Carolina Department of Insurance and offers free unbiased information about Medicare, Medicare prescription drug coverage, Medicare Advantage, long-term care insurance and other health insurance issues. In addition to helping Medicare beneficiaries compare and enroll in plans during the Open Enrollment Period, SHIIP counselors can help people find out if they are eligible for Medicare cost savings programs.

Here are some of the ways to review and compare plans available for 2018:

Get one-on-one help from SHIP, the Seniors' Health Insurance Information Program by calling 1-855-408-1212, Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Beneficiaries can also request in-person assistance in their home county.

 Visit www.medicare.gov/find-a-plan to compare current coverage and enroll in a new plan if changes are needed.

• Review the Medicare & You handbook, which was mailed to beneficiaries in September. Call 1-800-MEDICARE (1-800-633-4227) 24-hours a day, seven days a week, to find

out more about coverage options. TTY users should call 1-877-486-2048.
