Golf Tournament to Benefit Renovation of the Kilwinning Lodge #64 AF&AM



The lodge, chartered in 1813, built its two-story home between 1851 and 1857

at the southwest corner of South Greene and West Morgan streets. In 1951 the building was moved one block south. Research by Calvin Gaddy indicates that the lodge building is one of the oldest in town, preceded by the Boggan-Hammond House (1796), Troy House on Hall Street (1801), Leavitt House (1832) and the Alexander Little Wing (1839). The lodge has been a positive force in Anson County since its inception. Today its

members support Anson County charities in addition to the Masonic Home for Children at Oxford and the Masonic and Eastern Star Home in Greensboro.

Anson Landfill Expansion

With the intent of expanding the landfill capacity more than twofold, the North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality has issued a draft permit for the proposed horizontal and vertical expansion of the Anson Landfill.

This would increase the disposal area from 133.10 acres to 198.44 acres and the maximum landfill height would be raised by 70 feet, taking the total capacity from 21.6 million cubic yards to an alarming 41.5 million cubic yards. This expansion is deeply concerning and we urge all citizens

of Anson County to attend this public hearing. Your voice matters, and we must act together to protect our

environment and ensure that the Anson Landfill does not increase its capacity to unacceptable levels. We urge you to come and speak up for the safety of Anson County and beyond.
