Domestic Violence Coalition Holds Candlelight Vigil

On Thursday, October 23 the Anson County Courthouse provided the setting for the Anson County Domestic Violence Coalition's annual Candlelight Vigil, which was dedicated to all the Anson victims who have lost their lives to domestic violence. There were 13 deaths represented by a standing silhouette in their honor. ACDVC Executive Director Karen Baucom along with her staff facilitated the evening ceremony.

Sheriff Tommy Allen provided unnerving statistics and helped to put it all into perspective by saying, "The number of US troops killed in Afghanistan and Iraq is 6,614 - and the number of women, in the same period, killed as the result of domestic violence in the US is 11,766." You could hear a gasp of concern echo throughout the crowd of approximately 100 citizens in attendance. That one statistic seemed to hit home the staggering problem that exists and the need to continue efforts to save those who are victims. At the foot of each silhouette a purple flower was laid and the names of the victims

were read aloud. Victims include Daisy Coleman Melton, Larry Lindsey, Connie Newton, Mary Polk, Danette Streater, Cindy B. McIntyre, Mary Jane Lee Suess, Sherri Feely Marshall, Deborah Annette Wall Smith, Linda Kay Walters, Rebecca B. Morrow, Argatha H. Clark and Laura Parker. \overline{W} adesboro Police Sergeant Patty Williams read a poem and admitted that she too was

a child of domestic violence. "When I was growing up this wasn't talked about openly, but rather swept under the rug. Women suffered in silence and in shame. The Domestic Violence Coalition has helped tremendously in righting that wrong," said Williams.

Melody Goodwin sang a song in tribute. Students from Anson New Technology High School danced. And the Anson High School Varsity Majorettes twirled while honoring victims and their families.

The vigil ended with the lighting of the candles, a moment of silence, the release of purple balloons and these words: "Domestic violence and abuse are used for one purpose, to gain and maintain total control over you. An abuser doesn't play fair. Abusers use fear, guilt, shame and intimidation to wear you down and keep you beneath them. An abuser may also threaten you, hurt you, or hurt those around you.'
