Illegal Game Machine Operators Busted

Wadesboro Police partnered with agents from North Carolina Alcohol Law Enforcement (ALE) in the arrests of nine people for operating illegal gaming machines in retail outlets around Wadesboro. The arrests were made on Monday, November 5.

Wadesboro police officers, along with about 20 ALE agents, participated in the enforcement action. Gaming machines, currency and documents were seized.

In North Carolina it is illegal for anyone or any corporation to own, operate or play any machine or device that entitles the user to money or anything of value.

"Gambling can be addictive and destructive. It's caused bankruptcies, divorces and suicides," said Chris Poole, ALE's Special Agent in charge of the Gaming Section. "State legislators outlawed gaming machines to protect vulnerable citizens, and ALE is the lead agency in enforcing these laws."

Wadesboro Police Chief Thedis Spencer requested ALE's help due to multiple complaints. "Ever since these gaming machines came, we've seen crime going up – robberies, domestic issues and embezzlement cases," Spencer said. "ALE's enforcement action today will put a deterrent on any other video gaming operators trying to come into the area with their get-rich-quick schemes."
