Farmers and Ranchers Urged to Vote in Committee Elections

The 2013 Farm Service Agency County Committee Elections began on Nov. 4, when ballots were mailed to eligible voters. The deadline to return the ballots to local FSA offices is Dec. 2, 2013. County committee members are an important component of the operations of FSA and provide a link between the agricultural community and USDA. Farmers and ranchers elected to county committees help deliver FSA programs at the local level, applying their knowledge and judgment to make decisions on commodity price support programs; conservation programs; incentive indemnity and disaster programs for some commodities; emergency programs and eligibility. FSA committees operate within official regulations designed to carry out federal laws.

To be an eligible voter, farmers and ranchers must participate or cooperate in an FSA program. A person who is not of legal voting age, but supervises and conducts the farming operations of an entire farm may also be eligible to vote.

Eligible voters in local administrative area LAA-2 (Peachland, Polkton, Wadesboro & Lilesville) who do not receive ballots in the coming week can obtain ballots from their local USDA Service Center. Dec. 2, 2013, is the last day for voters to submit ballots in person to local USDA Service Centers. Ballots returned by mail must also be postmarked no later than Dec. 2. Newly elected committee members and their alternates will take office Jan. 1, 2014.

The candidates in this year's election are: Dale McRae is nominated in LAA 2, Anson County, to serve as a committee member. McRae resides at 2874 Pinkston River Road and has produced Corn, Wheat, Soybeans & Hogs for 25 years. He is an active member of Farm Service Agency County Committee and serves as Chairman.
