

- 2) Hospice cares for people with any kind of life-limiting illness. 3) Hospice is fully covered by Medicare, Medicaid, and most
- private health plans and HMOs.
- 4) Hospice is not limited to six months of care.
- 5) Hospice is not "giving up"; rather the focus is on caring,
- not curing.

6) Anyone can contact hospice - so call your local program to learn if hospice is right for you or your loved one.




