In 2011 Toys for Tots came to Anson County under the guidance of Commissioner Sturdivant. Sturdivant said, "During our first campaign we were blessed to collect and distribute toys to over 1,500 children. Since then the number has grown to over 3,000 children. Each year the need gets greater. Now more than ever we need the assistance of our community, businesses, churches, schools and citizens to make this program a continued success."

During the Toys for Tots conference held in September at the National Conference Center in Washington, DC, Anson County's local campaign was recognized for having

a successful campaign each year. The Toys for Tots Foundation is the largest non-profit

organization in the world. It all began in 1947, with a hand crafted doll, Raggedy Ann, and a Marine who heard a mother's prayer that her kids would not get anything for Christmas. Marine Reserve Major Bill Hendrick and his wife shared with this less fortunate family, and this was the beginning of Toys for Tots. Major Hendrick and members of his Marine Reserve Unit collected and distributed 5,000 toys the first year. The seed was planted and Toys for Tots was born.

The following year, in 1948, the Marine Corps Reserve adopted the program and collected and distributed toys in 74 communities nationwide. The Toys for Tots program has grown tremendously since its inception. Today Toys for Tots serves nearly 800 local communities covering all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Guam, Puerto Rico, and the Virgin Islands.

2018 Affordable Care Act (Obamacare) **Open Enrollment Runs Until December 15**

Apply online for tax subsidies to offset premium cost - shortened enrollment period this year

North Carolina Insurance Commissioner Mike Causey reminds residents that Open Enrollment for the 2018 Federal Health Insurance Exchange, also called the Affordable Care Act or Obamacare, is open now, and runs through December 15 with coverage to start January 1, 2018. "This is a shorter enrollment period than previous years," said Commissioner Causey

'If you do not have health insurance elsewhere, you need to take part in Open Enrollment to make sure you choose the best insurance plan to meet your needs as well as determine if you qualify for tax subsidies to offset premium costs."

Enrolling in an Affordable Care Act or ACA health insurance plan online at www.healthcare.gov is the only way to take advantage of tax subsidies to help pay for premiums. It is estimated nearly 85% of ACA insured members with the state's largest insurer, Blue Cross and Blue Shield, will be eligible for Advanced Premium Tax Credit Subsidies.

Outside the Open Enrollment period, the only way to buy health insurance from Healthcare gov under the ACA is to qualify for special enrollment due to having a child or adopting children, losing health coverage or moving. Under the Affordable Care Act, residents are required to maintain ACA compliant in-

- surance or be subject to penalty. Residents are guaranteed to be insurable and are encouraged to sign up for health insurance if they meet one of the following conditions:
- They have current qualifying ACA coverage but may want to change their plan for 2018. • They don't have health insurance through their employer or their spouse's employer.
- They don't have government coverage (such as veterans, Medicare and Medicaid). They are older than age 26 and can no longer be on a parent's health insurance.
- To enroll in or change 2018 ACA health insurance policies, consumers may visit www.healthcare.gov.

Consumer specialists at the N.C. Department of Insurance are available to answer any questions during ACA Open Enrollment by calling 1-855-408-1212.

"The N.C. Department of Insurance is in full support of giving consumers broad access to quality, affordable healthcare," said Commissioner Causey. "We are doing our best to maintain a stable health insurance market that provides new products and more choices.
