School Board Meeting is November 20

The Anson County Board of Education will hold their regular monthly meeting on Monday, November 20. The meeting will open in the Administrative Conference Room and go immediately into Closed Session. Open Session to the public will be held in the Administrative Board Room. Both meeting rooms are located at 320 Camden Road in Wadesboro.

Closed Session will begin immediately after the opening of the meeting at 4:00 p.m. for the purpose of discussing matters related to personnel and property pursuant to NCGS 143.318.11 (a)(6) and NCGS 143.318.11 (a)(5). Open Session to the public will begin at 5:30 p.m.

The meeting will be live streamed on the Anson County Schools' YouTube channel for the public to view. To find the channel you can search YouTube for "Anson County Schools."

If the public wishes to sign up for public comment, they can sign up in-person. A sign-up sheet will be available 30 minutes before the meeting begins for any individual or group to indicate their desire to address the board.

Monroe Expressway: Five Years of Connecting Communities

On November 27, 2018, the Monroe Expressway opened to provide travelers a congestion-free option when traveling through and in Union County. During the first 12 months of operations more than 4.7 million vehicles drove the Monroe Expressway, averaging 393,000 vehicles per month. In the past 12 months from October 2022 to September 2023, more than 7.6 million vehicles drove the Monroe Expressway, averaging 634,000 vehicles per month. Of the 7.6 million vehicles taking the Monroe Expressway, 12 percent are commercial trucks, providing more reliable travel time for North Carolina's freight and truck traffic.

The Monroe Expressway is an all-electronic toll road extending 18 miles from U.S. 74 near Interstate 485 in Mecklenburg County to U.S. 74 between the towns of Wingate and Marshville in Union County. The four-lane roadway provides seamless travel without having to slow down or stop to pay tolls.

Pat Kahle, President and CEO of the Union County Chamber of Commerce who was present at the opening of the Monroe Expressway, recently said, "The Monroe Expressway has been a wonderful addition to Union County's road network. Not only does it provide a faster alternative for our residents to get where they want to go, it is taking through traffic off of U.S. 74, so it is easier for people to shop at businesses located on our community's busiest corridor."

James "JJ" Eden, Executive Director of the North Carolina Turnpike Authority, said, "We are in the business of working with local communities to address their critical infrastructure needs. The Monroe Expressway continues to be very popular with a nearly 40 percent increase in traffic since opening."

Drivers who travel with a NC Quick Pass transponder save 35 percent on tolls in North Carolina. Currently, there are more than half a million NC Quick Pass accounts in the state. On the Monroe Expressway more than half of all customers choose to travel with a transponder to save on tolls.

To provide outstanding customer service for NC Quick Pass customers there are two local Customer Service Centers, one in Monroe and one in Charlotte.

In FY2023, the two service centers assisted 18,700 and

Railroad Crossings to Undergo Maintenance

CSX Railroad has a railroad tie team scheduled to work in Anson and Richmond Counties from November 27 to December 1. Affected crossings will be closed for 3 to 5 days, except for crossings with only one way in or out. Those will be closed for approximately 12 hours. During the closures no vehicles will be able to cross over.

There are five crossings that are one way in or out with homes behind. According to Angela Nelis of Southern Commercial Development Traffic Control (SCD), a supervisor will notify the residents of the closing so that they can plan accordingly. SCD will be implementing detours during the closures.
