meteorologist Ahrens engaged seventh grade students Tuesday, October 11 during his visit to Anson Middle School. Students had been studying weather and atmosphere in their science classes and Ahrens was able to reinforce their studies utilizing unique and entertaining methods to describe weather issues.

Ahrens shared some of his stories from chasing tornados, being rescued in the ocean, to covering Hurricane Matthew in Myrtle Beach. All seventh graders were able to be entertained by his talk and explosive actions. Several students volunteered to be representations of weather attributes such as the sun, earth, high pressure, low pressure, cold weather and hot weather. Students were able to gain a new perspective on weather by this visit.

Ahrens shared safety tips and the dan-

gers associated with the current societal need to video and record natural disasters. Ahrens is an American Meteorological Society Certified Broadcast Meteorologist (CBM) and also carries a degree in Broadcast Journalism from Kent State University.

A new program funded by the Partnership is ReadyRosie, an online literacy program where parents and caregivers receive a short video each weekday by email or text, modeling activities they can do with their young children to promote learning using simple, daily events.
