Green Sentenced to Life Without Parole in 2017 Scotland County Murder Case

During the November 17, 2025 session of Scotland County Criminal Superior Court, Defendant Terrence Terrell Green pled guilty to First-Degree Murder and two counts of Assault with a Deadly Weapon with the Intent to Kill Inflicting Serious Injury. Green received a sentence of life without the possibility of parole.

He entered his guilty plea on the morning jury selection was set to begin.

According to the State, the evidence would have shown that on the afternoon of March 29, 2017, Green broke into a home on Tuskeegee Avenue, fatally shooting Deangelo Patterson and seriously injuring two others. District Attorney Jamie Adams and Assistant District Attorney Matthew Victory represented the State.

District Attorney Adams thanked the community for its support in bringing the case to resolution. "My office will continue to prioritize the prosecution of violent crimes with the use of firearms against our citizens," Adams said. "The community's support and willingness to participate in the prosecution of this case was the main contributing factor in the defendant's decision to plead guilty. Remember, if you see something, say something — it may save someone's life.

Adams also thanked the Laurinburg Police Department for its investigation and the citizens who reported for jury service.

Rebecca Sue Pressley Sikes, 87, of Polkton, passed away on Tuesday, November 11, 2025, at her home, surrounded by her loved ones.


