Anson County's September Unemployment Rate Dropped to 4.6%

Anson County's unemployment rate for September dropped from August's low 5.3% to 4.6%. Statewide the unemployment rate was 4% in September.

Anson's total labor force in September was 10,507. Of that number 10,023 were employed and 484 were unemployed. In August the total labor force was 10,261 with 9,8716 employed and 545 unemployed.

Unemployment rates (not seasonally adjusted) decreased in 99 of North Carolina's counties in September and remained unchanged in one. Scotland County had the highest unemployment rate at 6.9 percent, while Buncombe County had the lowest at 3.1 percent. All 15 of the state's metro areas experienced rate decreases.

Among the metro areas, Rocky Mount at 5.8 percent had the highest rate and Asheville had the lowest rate at 3.3 percent. The September not seasonally adjusted statewide rate was 4.0 percent.

When compared to the same month last year, not seasonally adjusted unemployment rates decreased all 100 counties. All 15 metro areas experienced rate decreases

The number of workers employed statewide (not seasonally adjusted) increased in September by 83,815 to 4,769,398, while those unemployed decreased 20,778 to 197,787. Since September 2016, the number of workers employed statewide increased 109,529, while those unemployed decreased 45,252.

North Carolina's Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP)

The Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP) gives families a one-time vendor payment to help pay their heating bills. Families must meet all of the following: an income test, be responsible for its heating bills and include a U.S. citizen or an eligible alien.

To apply for the program, the following information is needed: name, date of birth, and social security numbers for each household member; household's income; savings and checking accounts; and property, stocks, bonds, and other assets. Applications will be taken for a household member age 60 and above or disabled person receiving a service through the Division of Aging and Adult Services (DAAS), beginning December 1. All other households may apply beginning January 1. This program will end March 31, unless funds are exhausted.

Farmers Urged to

Participate in the Ag Census

Looking around Anson it's obvious that agriculture plays a huge role in our county! Not only are we ranked #16 in cash receipts in North Carolina, we are ranked #9 for turkeys and #10 for broilers out of 100 NC counties. How could I know that? The Ag Census plays a huge part in knowing how we compare to other counties across our

Why is that important? There are many reasons to

consider. The census provides much needed information and input for ag planning and decision making by the US Department of Agriculture in regard to ag research, conservation programs, new technologies, rural economic development, production practices, telecommunications expansion, transportation and marketing, military veteran farmer programs, and the Farm Bill. The census also gives farmers a voice, telling their story of how they provide food, fuel, fiber and feed to the world.

According to the USDA, "The census is the only source of uniform, comprehensive agricultural data for every state, county, or county equivalent in the nation. By participating in the census you help show the value and importance of U.S. Agriculture."

It's sometimes hard to imagine that commodities

grown right here in Anson County might end up on a table across the country, or in other countries. Of course we need to have a voice in decisions that our leaders make about agriculture! So, how can you be a part of making a difference and sharing that voice? Participate in the census, every five years. Here are some of the FAQs about the Ag Census:

1. What is considered a farm to the census? A farm is any location that produced and sold, or normally would sell, \$1,000 or more of ag products during the census year.

2. Will the information collected be kept confidential? Yes. Results are tallied and available in aggregate form only. No individual operation can be identified in census data collected. 3. How often is the census done? Every five years there is an Ag Census taken. It is a comprehensive count of all US farms and ranches, and all commodities are included. 4. Do I have to respond to the census? If you receive a

Census of Ag form in the mail, response is required by law. 5. When will the Census happen? Forms will be mailed in December 2017, and must be completed by the form or online by February 2018. In February 2019 census data will be released by the National Agricultural Statistic Service (NASS). 6. Can I respond to the census online? Yes! Visit the following site for online responses to the Census: www.agcounts.usda.gov.

7. Where can I go for general info and questions about the census? Questions can be asked by calling 888-424-7828, or by visiting www.agcensus.usda.gov. More information can be collected at the NC Cooperative Extension – Anson
