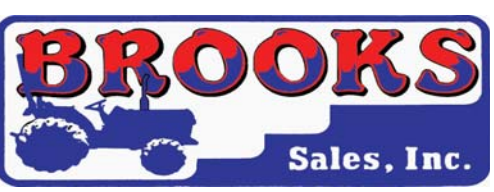
Storytime Every Wednesday

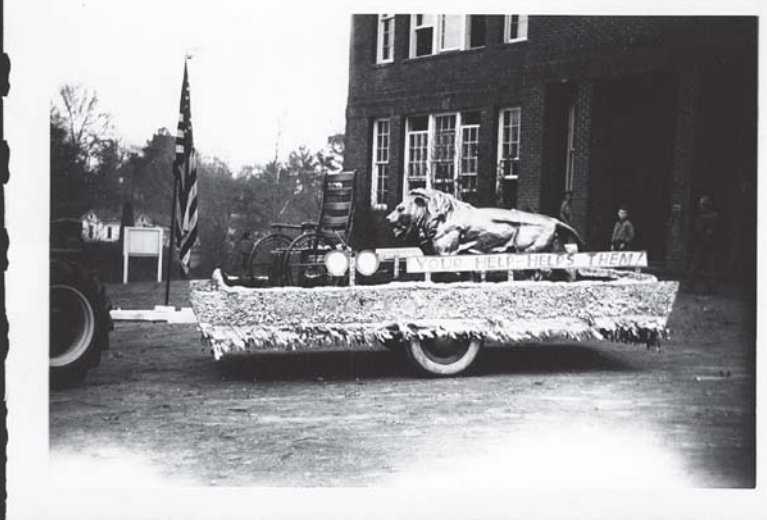

The float pictured above was a "homemade" float that was built by the Wadesboro Lions Club in 1952. It was built on a farm trailer and pulled by a "Bob Hurst" tractor from Early-Hurst Allis Chalmers.
Back in those days it was the "style" - really it was affordability - to build a homemade parade float.
Note the large lion (on loan from the Hamlet Lions Club), the wheelchair, glasses, and other items representing projects and services of the Lions Club. Of course there is the flag of the United States representing all of us. You may also recognize that this picture was made on the Wadesboro High School grounds.

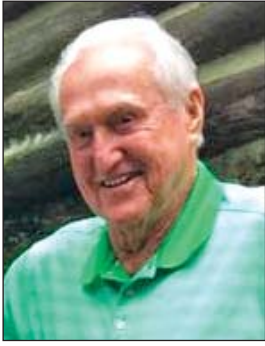

Mr. Kenneth "Kent" Carpenter, 82, died Monday, November 20, 2017, at Carolinas Medical Center Union in Monroe.
A private graveside service in Peachland Cemetery and a celebration of life service were held on Friday, November 24, 2017, at Harmony Community Church with his son, Rev. Rocky Carpenter, officiating.
