The Medicare enrollment period is now open and runs for the next seven weeks. Each year during the Open Enrollment Period, Medicare beneficiaries have the opportunity to compare and evaluate their current plan and make changes as necessary. By comparing plans during the Open Enrollment Period, Medicare beneficiaries can save money and ensure their 2020 plan is best suited to meet their needs.

The Open Enrollment Period began Tuesday, October 15, and all changes must be made by December 7 to ensure coverage begins without interruption January $1,\,2020.$
