Our priorities continue to focus on student achievement and overall learning improvement as we fully implement new

standards, new curriculum and new assessments. I can say with confidence that our staff design and facilitate daily instructional strategies to ensure each student is successful. My confidence is based on proven success. For example, please consider the following improvements made over

the past five years: Our Graduation rate has improved from 64.3% to 78.9%

3rd grade Reading proficiency has improved from 38.4% to 65.9%

• 4th grade Reading proficiency has improved from 40% to 70%

5th grade Reading proficiency has improved from 40% to 64.9%

• 6th grade Reading proficiency has improved from 41% to 71%

5th grade Science proficiency has improved from 27% to 55%

7th graders scoring a 3 or 4 on Algebra I End of Course Test has improved from 11% to 97% $\bullet$  High school Biology students scoring a 3 or 4 on End of Course Test has improved from 32% to 70%

Though we have much work still to do, student achievement is on the rise in every school, every classroom, and in every grade level.

As we prepare for 2013, we know the future is uncertain. Yet, what we do know is that our students can and will continue to learn to high standards. # Schools Partner with Thinkgate Performance System

To ensure that students in Anson County Schools meet and exceed state and national standards, the district partners with Thinkgate Performance System. Thinkgate, a cutting edge instructional improvement system, warehouses resources that drive the cycle of teaching and learning in all classrooms. There are 4 major components: 1) Curriculum, Common Core and Essential Standards, are what all learners

must know and be able to do. 2) Instruction addresses how learning is mastered using high quality classroom practices. 3) Assessments measure the degree to which students have mastered the curriculum. 4) Data from assessments is used to personalize student learning opportunities by affording teachers the opportunity to review, reflect, and adjust teaching and learning. The instructional documents housed in Thinkgate were written by Anson County teachers and ensure continuity

across the district. These resources are accessible 24/7 and serve as the foundation for all lesson planning. In accordance with the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction's Balanced Assessment System, staff are required to assess student learning throughout the year. These formative assessments are developed

and administered in Thinkgate, and provide timely and relevant data to determine gaps in student learning before end-of-course and end-of grade assessments. Through a grade level or departmental planning team process, teachers use assessment data to make decisions regarding what interventions or accelerations are appropriate for students on an individual and small group basis. Standards may be retaught using different strategies or students may advance to a more

challenging curriculum. Teaching and learning in the 21st century has evolved into a process to guarantee the promise of a college and career ready future to all students in the Anson County School system. Our affiliation with Thinkgate is but one avenue to support this pledge
