Animal Shelter Addresses Dog **Illness Spreading Across the State**

This is a release from the Anson County Animal Shelter: A wave of concern is sweeping across North Carolina as reports of a mysterious respiratory illness affecting dogs has surfaced. Several shelters in our area have witnessed a uisiuroing surge in canine respiratory cases in recent davs weeks and months. Unfortunately, this morning here at the Anson County Animal Shelter, we have four dogs showing signs of sickness with nasal discharge. The culprit behind this enigmatic illness remains a mystery, as its symptoms closely mimic those of other viral infections like influenza or kennel cough. Further complicating matters is the lack of diagnostic tests specifically designed for this ailment.

We here at the Anson County Animal Shelter, along with our Vet of Record and State Inspector are carefully monitoring the situation, particularly for signs of pneumonia, a severe complication that can arise from respiratory infections. All dogs housed in this area of the shelter are being treated medically for their symptoms. We will be transparent and keep the community well informed of what is happening in the shelter. We know many of you care about the animals we are entrusted to care for, as much as we do. Caring for and

stopping the spread in our facility is our number one priority. We are urging all pet owners to please be on high alert for any unusual behavior or symptoms in your dogs, such as coughing, ocular or nasal discharge, sneezing, loss of

appetite, labored breathing and lethargy. We are canceling public outings with our dogs currently, limiting public viewing and interactions and ceasing adoptions and INTAKES (strays and owner surrenders), except for EMERGENCIES for the next two weeks. This is due to the unknown nature of the illness, raising the possibility of dogs contracting the virus from infected dogs in our care and attempting to stop the spread early and quickly. If the situation

is not controlled, depopulation of the shelter could be possible. We care deeply for these animals and do not want that, if the situation can be avoided by simply not intaking dogs. If you have questions or concerns, please contact us here at the Anson County Animal Shelter at 704-994-2738,


Brandon Chewning Appointed Wadesboro Police Chief
