Shopping in stores Taking advantage of the holiday sales is a great way to find good deals, but remember the bad guys are looking for ways to take advantage of the shopping frenzy that happens this time of year. When out shopping don't let your wallet or purse be an easy target for theft. Keep it close to your body to make it more difficult for thieves to steal. Remember, back pockets are very easy targets for pick pockets. Also, carry only one credit or debit card to use on your shopping trip. It a thief strikes you will only have to cancel one card. This minimizes the opportunity for fraud. If paying cash only take it out when the cashier asks for payment and avoid "flaunt-Finally, always be aware of your surroundings, and especially stay

alert while you are in or around your vehicle. Always lock your vehicle. Never leave anything out in the open in case thieves are doing their "window shopping" in the parking lot! Only park in well lit areas. Be sure to look around your vehicle before approaching it. Online shopping Different dangers lurk for online shoppers.
