According to the latest information posted by the Anson County Health Department on Wednesday, December 14 the county was at 8009 total Covid-19 cases, with 37 of those cases active and 100 deaths. On November 30 the county was at 7,958 total Covid-19 cases, with 10 active and 100 deaths. On November 17 the county was at 7,940 total Covid-19 cases, with 25 active and 100 deaths.

The Health Department offers Moderna COVID) Vaccines on Thursdays. They offer the primary series and the bivalent "Fall" booster. They are offered on Thursdays in a walk-in clinic. No appointment is necessary.

Flu Shots Please note that flu numbers are high right now so if you have not gotten a flu shot, please do so. If you would like to schedule an appointment for a shot, please call (704) 694-5188.

The COVID testing site in Morven has closed, but you can still stop by the health department and pick up test kits to keep at home. If you aren't feeling well you can send someone and they will send some to you.

The Health Department is also offering N-95 masks. Stop in to pick one up.

Anson County and the Town of Ansonville Receive \$950,000 Grants

27 North Carolina Communities Receive \$42.3 Million in Neighborhood Revitalization Grants

The North Carolina Department of Commerce awarded 30 Community Development Block Grant - Neighborhood Revitalization (CDBG-NR) fund requests to 27 local governments totaling \$42.3 million. The requests will provide housing and public improvements for low- and moderateincome North Carolinians. The Town of Ansonville and Anson County each received \$950,000 block grants. "North Carolina has made significant investments in our communities to help them provide affordable housing," said Governor Roy Cooper. "Building stronger and more resilient communities is important to our economic success and these neighborhood revitalization grants will support them in doing just that.' The CDBG-NR program offers non-entitlement municipalities and counties the opportunity to tailor community development projects to address the specific and most critical needs of their communities. This year's awards include \$5 million in funding that was earmarked by the N.C General Assembly exclusively for the Rural Community Development (RCD) Fund, a set aside for non-housing community development projects in Tier 1 and Tier ${ar 2}$ counties. Anson County is a Tier 1 county. "These additional federal resources will help our most vulnerable communities as building and living costs have increased," said N.C. Commerce Secretary Machelle Baker Sanders. "This is a banner year for economic development and this infusion of funding will greatly benefit more North Carolina families and local economies by providing more housing options, jobs, and economic opportunities. The program conducted two rounds of funding with increased maximum per grant awards to offset the rising construction costs and other special needs that were impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic. The first round of funding included 18 projects receiving a total of \$15.7 million in CDBG-NR awards up to \$950,000. Round two of CDBG-NR funding included 12 projects totaling \$26.6 million with a maximum award of \$5 million. The CDBG program is a U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) program administered in part by N.C. Commerce Rural Economic Development Division. CDBG funds are awarded to enhance the vitality of communities by providing adequate housing, suitable living environments, infrastructure development, and expanding economic opportunities. The State must ensure that at least 70 percent of its CDBG grant funds are used for activities and projects that serve households of low- and moderate-income. 

North Carolina's November Employment Figures Released

The state's seasonally adjusted November 2022 unemployment rate was 3.9 percent, increasing 0.1 of a percentage point from October's revised rate. The national rate remained unchanged at 3.7 percent.

North Carolina's unemployment rate decreased 0.3 of a percentage point from a year ago. The number of people employed decreased 8,381 over the month to 4,925,524 and increased 141,392 over the year. The number of people unemployed increased 6,442 over the month to 200,523 and decreased 10,115 over the year.

Seasonally adjusted Total Nonfarm employment, as gathered through the monthly establishment survey, increased 5,300 to 4,838,100 in November. Major industries experiencing increases were Leisure & Hospitality Services, 4,500; Financial Activities, 2,300; Education & Health Services, 1,700; Government, 1,100; and Other Services, 100. Major industries experiencing decreases were Trade, Transportation & Utilities, 2,000; Professional & Business Services, 1,400; Construction, 500; Manufacturing, 300; and Information, 200. Mining & Logging employment remained unchanged.

Since November 2021, Total Nonfarm jobs increased 199,100 with the Total Private sector increasing by 186,200 and Government increasing by 12,900. Major industries experiencing increases were Professional & Business Services, 50,500; Leisure & Hospitality Services, 44,200; Education & Health Services, 31,900; Financial Activities, 14,100; Government, 12,900; Manufacturing, 11,800; Trade, Transportation & Utilities, 11,500; Construction, 11,400; Other Services, 7,500; and Information, 3,400. The only major industry experiencing a decrease over the year was Mining & Logging, 100.
