Each child who attended the literacy event was given a copy of the The Reader to enjoy at home, as well as a small bag of hot chocolate, cider, and crackers - just like the little boy in the story. Each classroom was also given a copy of The Reader and Two Good Friends to share over and over throughout the winter months and remember the Winter Wonderland of the literacy event.
