The Cats, dressed in all orange for an orange crush kind of night, made their way through the North gates instead of from the field house, allowing them to march in, just in front of the stands. It seemed to get their blood pumping early as the fans stood and cheered.



Coach Luke Hyatt said, "This was a great win for us and our kids played well. We got down 10-0, but then turned it on. We scored on our next five complete drives. Diondre Pratt had numerous huge blocks on the perimeter to help spring some long runs. When we are hitting on all cylinders, we are a pretty good football team. I thought our defense made some huge plays to help us take the lead for good. We gave up a couple big plays, but besides that, we held a real, real good offensive football team under control. Kevin Leak made some big plays in the secondary and made 8 tackles to lead our defense. Special Teams played exceptionally well.'

For Anson, Brandon Smith had 28 carries, 138-yards and 1 touchdown. Rodrick Evans had 11 carries for 57-yards and 3 touchdowns. Dareus Little, 4 carries for 67-yards and 1 TD. Diondre Pratt, 1 carry for 12-yards. Evans was 2-4 passing for 59-yards. Smith, 1 catch for 18-yards and Little, 1 catch for 41-yards.

Hyatt continued, "I thought our offensive line took the game over during the second guarter. We had a big 18-play drive in between the third and fourth that took a lot of the wind out of the Spartan's sail. What a great drive.

In typical Anson versus Sun Valley fashion, it was late in the fourth when I peered at the scoreboard to see what would be a comfortable lead if playing any other team. But just like most years, both of these teams can find a way to pull themselves out of a whole with not a lot of time left on the clock. It was getting pretty intense in those closing minutes, with Sun Valley scoring late while closing the gap. But the Bearcats held on with all their might and pulled this victory off nicely, now 1-0 in conference play. "We have to stay hungry for the coming weeks," Hyatt concluded.
