Anson County was once the largest county in North Carolina, encompassing all of 44 counties and a part of three more. Even Allen and I don't remember that...

It is hard to imagine, but Anson County, in its beginning, covered land all the way to the Mississippi River. Later the county extended from Laurinburg, NC to Murphy, NC. And, did you know that the settlers in Mecklenburg and Cabarrus, the Germans in and around Salisbury and Rowan - even the Moravians of Wachovia were all a part of Anson County.

There are quite a few churches and buildings that have "withstood" time (and the wrecking ball) and are still in use today. Some of them are the Episcopal Churches in Wadesboro and Ansonville (1880), the Long Pine Methodist Church, Kilwinning Masonic Lodge (1851), the Rocky River Baptist Church, and many more.
